

NAVIGO COLLEGE CHECKLIST FOR COLLEGE-BOUND, GRADUATING SENIORS- Spring 2020

BEFORE MAY 1

1. Confirm intent to enroll at college of choice by May 1 (this may involve a fee)
 - a. Let other colleges know you are withdrawing your acceptance/application
2. Accept financial aid package and/or scholarships
3. Apply for housing and pay deposit by May 1 (if applicable)- earlier the better
4. Ensure all personal info is up to date (Is your name spelled correctly? Do you have a new email address?)
5. Register for orientation/registration date (this may involve a fee)

BEFORE ORIENTATION/REGISTRATION

6. Complete placement testing if needed (prior to orientation/registration)
7. Register any documented disabilities (prior to orientation/registration)
8. Consider applying for applicable transition programs and or TRiO programs you qualify for (Student Support Services, Diversity programs and services, etc.)

AT ORIENTATION/REGISTRATION

9. Get student ID
10. Register for classes
11. Double check with financial aid office that everything is in place (did you get chosen for verification?)
12. If you registered for classes- reserve textbooks/order them
13. Sign up for campus alert system (likely a text system)
14. Parents- investigate parent association (may be a fee), parent advisory group, parent resource contact

BEFORE FIRST DAY OF CLASSES

15. Purchase parking permit
16. Submit final high school transcript
17. Pay tuition and fees
18. Choose meal plan

***If you attended various orientation/registrations at different schools and registered for classes- you MUST WITHDRAW from those classes at the schools you are not planning to attend, or you will be charged for them!*

FIRST WEEK OF CLASSES AND BEYOND

19. *Attend class! Many schools have policies in place that if you do not attend classes in those first few weeks, you will be dropped. This can seriously impact your financial aid/scholarships.*
20. *GET INVOLVED! Attend opportunities to learn about student organizations and on campus employment. Students who are connected to their college/university through extracurricular organizations and/or student employment have higher GPAs and graduate at a higher rate than those who do not!*
